


BARLOW CHURCH (ST. LAWRENCE)



Dear Friends,



Hello! We would like to welcome everyone back for the new academic year. We have new pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 4. By now, we hope they have settled into the new environment. They had a fabulous time on the transition sessions before summer and we know they are very excited to be in 'Big School'. We are looking forward to a year filled with sporting events, musical activities, enterprise, school productions, trips and residential visits, alongside the hard work we do every day. Our staff have been working hard to change and adjust the curriculum so we can give every child the best possible start to their education journey.

We have had some changes of class teachers for this year, with Mrs Wilson's retirement. Mrs Phipps becomes the main teacher in Amethyst class (Reception), with Mrs Watkin teaching on a Friday. 


