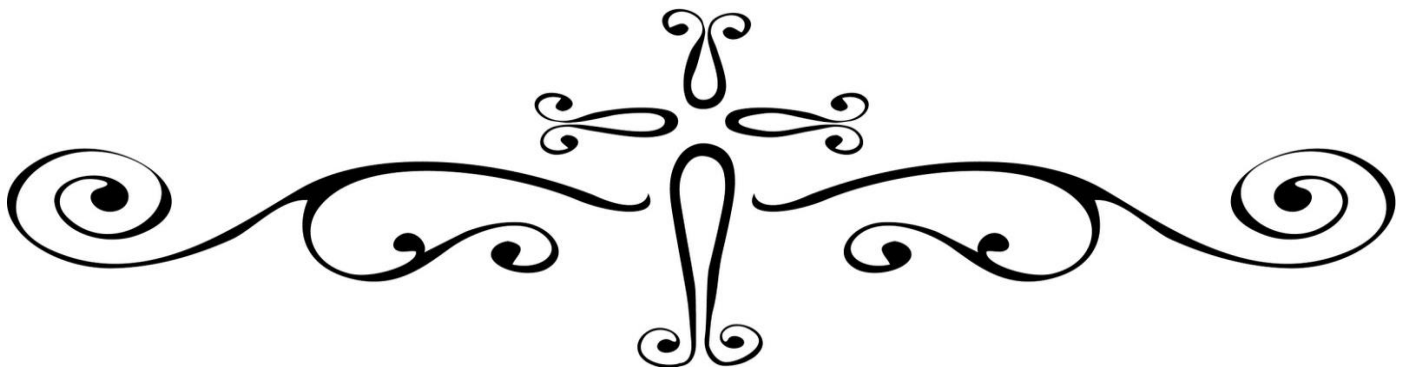

Dear Friends,

October, October, 'season of mists and mellow fruitfulness'.

What associations do we attach to each month as it goes/zips by? For July, it may be the end of the school year; for September, the end of the holidays; for December, obviously, Christmas; for January, New Year and so on. On a more personal note, it may be associations with birthdays or wedding anniversaries or, sadly, the passing of a loved one.

For me, October means birthday: One more clocked-up number! Interestingly, when you're a child, you just can't wait for the numbers to stack up! But when you're older – especially past the great 40 – birthday

numbers sometimes ring the knell of time in a new and unwanted way. As the decades roll by after that, year numbers at birthday times are often something to try to forget. 'What's in a number?' we say to ourselves or, 'You're as young as you feel.' This last saying may have real meaning attached to it, as many have found out. If you stay positive and keep some of your youthful ties, then you're in a better place for some of the less positive 'stuff' that life throws up at us.

Jesus, in his earthly mission, centred much of his teaching about what goes on – positively and negatively – in the human mind:

For it is from within, out of a person's heart, that evil thoughts come—sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, lewdness, envy, slander, arrogance and folly. All these evils come from inside and defile a person. (Mark 7. 21-23)

All the dark goings-on in the world today stem from dark thoughts, and vice-versa, the good from the good. A simple reality!

At the time of Jesus, in his part of the world, the most universal language was Greek. (All the New Testament in the Bible was written in Greek.) In Greek, there are 2 words for time: Chronos and Kairos. Chronos is to do with numerical time – back to birthdays! But Kairos is to do with the right time for something to take place – as when we say, 'It's time I contacted so-and-so about such-and-such.' When the Kairos moment comes to us, we recognise it: 'Now's the right time to look for a job.' This Kairos moment figures a lot in scripture:

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted ... (Ecclesiastes 3:1,2).

And about Jesus:

But when the right time came, God sent his Son, who was born from a woman and lived under the law. (Galatians 4:4)

All this means that we can rest in God's time. He has a purpose for us all, regardless of how many, or few, years we have under our belt.

So, when **your** birthday comes round, take heart and remember that the good Lord has you at His heart.

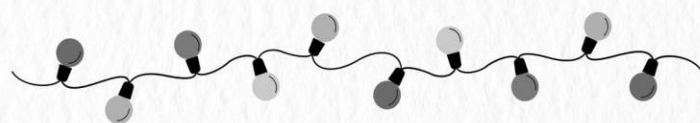


REQUIREMENTS FOR EXHIBITING YOUR TREE

Footpath Closure

The following notice of temporary footpath closure has been received:

DERBYSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL ORDER

TEMPORARY FOOTPATH CLOSURE PUBLIC FOOTPATH NO.59 (PART) BARLOW

WHEN: 30th September 2024 to 30th March 2025.

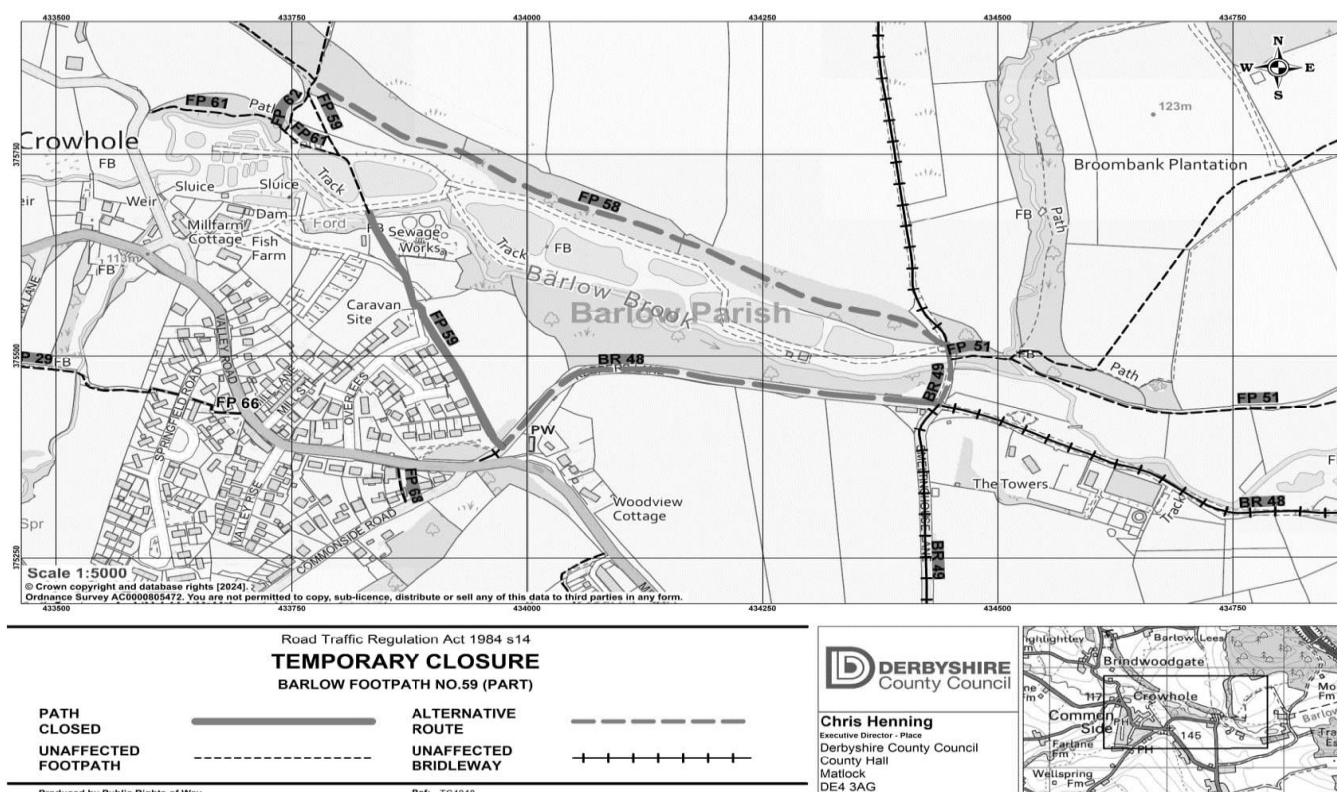
WHERE: Close footpath No.59 from Bridleway No.48 for approximately 340 meters.

REASON: To facilitate public safety during reprofiling the sewers and construction works.

ALTERNATIVE ROUTE:

From the south of the closure travel northeast along bridleway No.48. At bridleway No.49 travel north. At footpath No.58 travel northeast to meet footpath No.59. Access will be maintained, whenever reasonably possible, on the affected length of footpath. The footpath will re open as soon as the work is finished. This may be earlier than advertised. Derbyshire County Council apologises for any inconvenience caused while work takes place. Anyone needing further information should ring Call Derbyshire 01629 533190. The County Council has made an Order under Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) to prohibit its use by traffic.

We hope that all new reception children and their families have settled well into the school and are enjoying their time in Barlow.

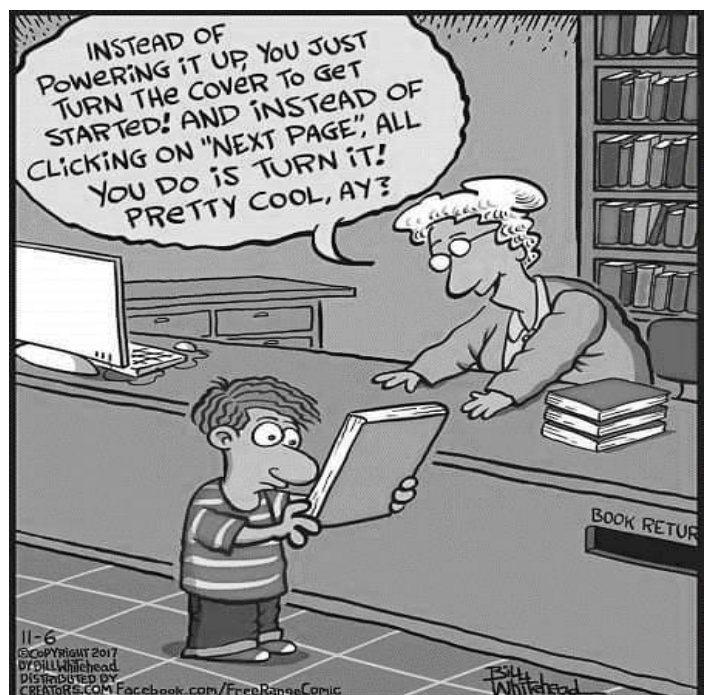





BARLOW PEOPLE

Dr Alan Hobson

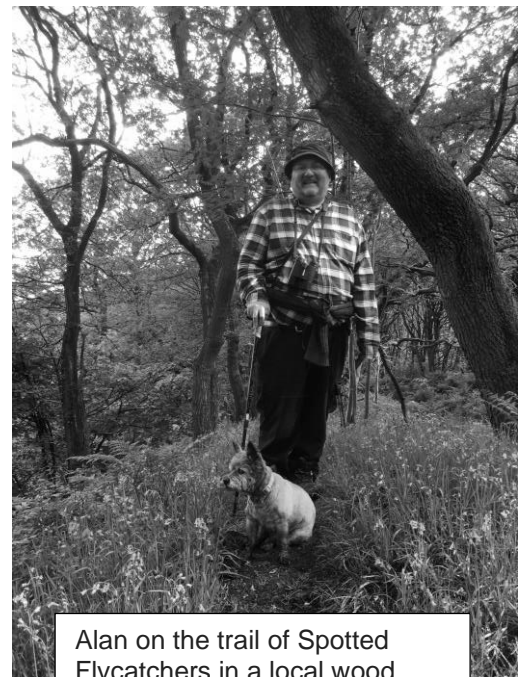
Next time you pass through Crow Hole, keep a look out for an animated figure in a floppy hat, a pair of binoculars pressed to his face, tracking a high flying bird. Chances are you'll have just spotted Dr Alan Hobson, probably Barlow's leading authority on all things ornithological.

For almost eight years now, Alan has lived on Springfield Road, just a few steps away, as many of us are, from breathtaking views and rich, varied and absorbing walks through glorious countryside. He's made good use of these treks, amassing an encyclopaedic knowledge of wildflowers. He can spot a False Oxslip at twenty paces, even without his trademark binoculars.

From Sheffield originally, Alan studied at Leeds University, gaining a PhD in History – hence the 'Dr' appellation, of which he is justly proud. He also began a long running career as an Associate Lecturer with the Open University, a role he has enjoyed for thirty years. From Leeds, he moved to Woodford Bridge in London, where he worked as a researcher in the House of Commons. He supported several MPs and Peers on cross-party issues, occasionally finding himself in highly unexpected situations. One of which being a fact finding mission to a military dictatorship in SE Asia, which held with it a very real risk of being on the receiving end of live ammunition! All very hush, hush – I've probably said too much already...

Alan has fond memories of spending time with a few very well known politicians. His two favourites are legendary Chesterfield MP Tony Benn, whom he describes as a 'warm, lovely man' and one Boris Johnson, MP for Hendon at the time, who was really helpful and supportive. In both cases, Alan says, they came across as being much nicer than their portrayal in the media.

Alan's deftness at working with politicians harmonised with his passion for history a few years ago, to good effect. He lent his voice to a campaign, supported by our MP at the time,

Lee Rowley, to have restoration work undertaken to help preserve our beautiful and historic Lea Bridge.

Alan's partner Janet makes regular trips down to Barlow from her home in York. We owe her a debt of gratitude too. She's part of a team of expert conservators who worked on the restoration of York Minster's magnificent east window, the largest expanse of medieval stained glass in the world.
