



# Dear Friends,

'Easter is late this year' is a comment that I've been hearing quite a lot recently.

And yes, it is - well, later than average. Apparently the earliest possible date for Easter in the Western Church is 22nd March and the latest is 25th April, so quite a wide range, unlike Christmas, which is always on a fixed date. That's because Easter is a 'moveable feast' and the date is determined by a lunisolar 'ecclesiastical' calendar similar to the Hebrew Calendar.

There's a lot more to it than that, of course, but what concerns me more is how this all works out in practice. We try to keep the special Holy Week and Easter service times fairly consistent from year to year, but the later festival means that our 8pm Vigil service on Holy Saturday (19<sup>th</sup> April) will probably start in twilight this year rather than the dark! The bonfire might not be quite so effective as a result, but as we sit in the ancient church hearing the old stories of liberation and night falls around us, our candles will still burn brightly with the new light of Easter.

And the following morning, the sun will be close to rising as our 6am Dawn Service at Old Brampton begins. That also includes a bonfire, and more candles too (Easter Egg Hunts follow after the later services in both churches – so that's 11am in Barlow). You're welcome to join us for either of these services or any of the Holy Week observances, details of which you'll find elsewhere (page 11).

You might be wondering why there are so many services, and indeed this season is much more demanding than Christmas in many ways. But in these challenging times, the stories of Holy Week and Easter hold extra and deeper resonances. We will follow, day by day, the gospel accounts of Jesus' arrest, trial and the crucifixion – of an innocent man condemned to death by people who were determined to hold onto power and maintain control, by any means. We will wait in vigil on Thursday evening, as if we too were waiting in the garden, watching and praying with him. And we will mark the hours from 12-3pm on Good Friday as a time for quiet prayer and reflection (after the morning event for children and families). After that we wait, until the new light of Easter is lit and the joy of Easter resurrection is upon us. But the Easter story doesn't stop there. You can find out what happened next in the Acts of the Apostles and we will hear those accounts in Church on the Sundays after Easter.

Retelling these stories and re-enacting the ancient rituals of our faith is important for Christians for they remind us of who we are as part of the Christian story today.

We are Easter people and we believe that, as Archbishop Desmond Tutu once said,

> Goodness is stronger than evil; Love is stronger than hate; Light is stronger than darkness; Life is stronger than death; Victory is ours through Him who loves us.

May the joy and peace of the risen Christ be with you this Easter. Rev'd Sarah

# **Easy Ribbed Flower Pattern**

Colour A: any colour

Colour B: scrap of contrasting yarn or button for

centre

Body of flower

Using colour A, cast on 60 stitches.

Rows 1-10: K2 P2 across whole row (for slightly smaller flower, do 8 rows).

Row 11: Knit 2 stitches together across the row. 30 stitches.

Row 12: Slip 1 stitch. Knit 2 stitches together & pass slip stitch over. Repeat across whole row. 10 stitches.

Break off yarn with long tail, thread back through remaining stitches & pull tight. Join edges with mattress stitch.

Centre of flower

Using colour B cast on 16 stitches.

Cast off.

Coil into a tight spiral & sew base to the centre.

Or use a button & sew to centre of flower.

Eventually we were off to The Winter Gardens at Blackpool. The day started badly: It was minus 5 degrees outside the Tickled Trout when we set off, the coach's door locks were frozen and the wheelbarrows had to travel on the coach with us.

Once there the day was fantastic. We were rehearsing on the stage where so many great entertainers had trodden and we went totally wrong! After a pork pie and a cup of tea it was back onto the stage in front of two thousand people, the four judges and a few cameras. No sign of stage fright this time, a great display and four YES votes from the judges made the journey home very memorable.


We had a brilliant day in the spotlight and everyone was really nice to us. Ant and Dec got in the spirit of things and guided us off stage with hand lights.

In our ten years we have raised just over £85,000 for local and national charities. # **HOLMESFIELD SCOUTS**

For the last 15 years 3rd Holmesfield Scout Group have been meeting weekly in less than ideal meeting places, including barns, portacabins and outdoor shelters. We have explored various options including designing and building a brand-new facility in Holmesfield, but rising costs and fewer fundraising opportunities have led us to try and secure a permanent home in Dronfield at the current headquarters on Wreakes Lane. Our original plan was to develop what was the existing building, but a few years ago it was deemed unsafe and sadly had to be demolished. Our small band of volunteers and 110 young people have, since then, been meeting in second hand portacabins which are damp, cold and very restrictive in terms of activity space.

Despite all the setbacks our membership has remained strong; we have remained at capacity for Beavers, Cubs, Scouts and Explorer Scouts with a group membership of over 100 young people, and now have a firm plan in place to develop Wreakes Lane Scout HQ on behalf of the whole district.

So far we have raised almost £120,000 pounds, with £50k coming from grants and £70k from our own fundraising and careful budgeting over 20+ years. The plan is to buy and install a 4-module building to create a large enough room for meetings and activities for both our group and others in and around Dronfield.

Planning permission has been granted and we have a local supplier on board with our plans. Our plan would also help in developing the space into a community bookable resource with a large secure enclosed activity field. Unfortunately, once again rising costs have left us short of our target by between £10k and £15k, so we are hoping that we can make a dent in that gap with donations, whilst continuing to apply for grants and fundraise ourselves!

We are at a critical point in the project as we are ready to place an order for the cabins and the associated groundworks. We have worked so hard and raised so much whilst continuing to provide weekly activities, camps, expeditions, hikes, DofE awards and other activities, but we find ourselves with a relatively small gap in funding to be filled quite quickly to enable our plan to be fully realised.

So, for the first time ever we are asking for your help via crowdfunding to allow us to bridge the funding gap as quickly as possible. Every little will help. Feel free to message us with any questions. Thank you. Jane Jakins https://gofund.me/849268b6


# **Book Club 1**
